

State Board of Education

Lawsuit to STOP the State Takeover of Public Education

- On Sept 19, 7 State Board of Education members, Democracy Forward, and Ulmer & Berne filed a lawsuit to stop the state takeover of public education
- On Sept 21, Franklin County Common Pleas Court Judge Karen Phipps granted a 2-week temporary restraining order (TRO) to pause the takeover; the TRO was later extended until Oct 20
- On Oct 2, Governor DeWine defied the TRO by continuing the state takeover on Oct 3

Fighting Back:

Elected members of the Ohio School Board filed suit in court in Franklin County on Tuesday, September 19th to stop this unlawful, anti-democratic takeover of public education in Ohio.

As attacks on education & other anti-democratic threats spread across the nation, we must continue to use all the tools we can to defend progress.







Building Honesty Organizing Power... together

The goal of Honesty Organizing is to fight for education justice by building power at the local school district level that connects at the statewide level.

The model we're using is a hybrid of "distributed leadership" and "relational" organizing.

What do we mean by "distributed leadership" and "relational"?

Distributed Leadership - Honesty creating a space for grassroots leaders to find community, access trainings and resources, and strategize with others across the state. Local leadership takes action in their districts and reports back to the statewide team.

Relational - Honesty staff and/or grassroots leaders building local power through intentional one-to-one relationship cultivation and leadership development.

Distributed-Relational Hybrid Model - Honesty aims to serve grassroots leaders in all 611 Ohio local school districts who want to organize for education justice in their local community—while also intentionally reaching "hotspot" communities where the need is urgent. The more grassroots leadership and staff capacity increases, the more intentional we can be.


We are on our way! In May, June & July had over 30 teams go to school board meetings!








By the end of 2023, we'll have AT LEAST two people in EVERY county showing up at school board meetings in PSS shirts & sharing updates!


How to Report Your Information

- Section 1: Basics on the meeting you are reporting on
- Section 2: Who attended the meeting and how many?
 (Moms for Liberty, PSS, other groups)
- Section 3: What was discussed? Main agenda items?
 Topics in public comments? Buzzwords?
- Section 4: Who is On School Board and where do they stand?
- Other info on you and your experience, issues to keep tracking, etc.

It is four sections long, plus one wrap up section. The data we collect will help researchers on extremism and on public school issues pull together patterns we can we need to strategize! 
Why School Board Elections Matter



School boards set the policies and priorities that determine how your school will function: student wellness, curriculum, budget, staffing, facilities, transportation, and building safety.

- Serve as a voice for the community
- Supervise, hire, and dismiss the superintendent
- Allocate school funding
- Protect the freedom to learn **OR censor education**, **enforce book bans**
- Embrace all races, cultures, identities OR target vulnerable, marginalized children
- Value, support teachers and staff **OR attack, drive educators away**

STEP 1: Find your candidates

Use these options to find school board candidates in your area

- Local Board of Elections website
 - Find your Board of Elections website HERE
 - Select What's on My Ballot and enter your address for a list of candidates or a sample ballot

STEP 2: Research your candidates

Use this checklist to research key information about the candidates.

- Campaign website and social media accounts (LinkedIn, Facebook, X (formerly Twitter), Instagram, etc.)
- Campaign endorsements and affiliations (IMPORTANT: these can have a strong influence on a candidate's values)
- Candidate interviews (visit Vote411.org to read unedited responses to candidate questions)
- News coverage (TV, radio, newspapers, letters to the editor, blogs, podcasts, candidate profiles, etc.)
- Place of employment
- Resume or curriculum vitae
- Lawsuits, litigation, criminal background, registries
- Personal social media accounts and blogs
- Personal affiliations (boards, committees, memberships, volunteer work, etc.)

STEP 3: Attend candidate events

Engage with candidates and ask questions at in-person, voter education events

- Candidate forums, debates, and town halls hosted by nonpartisan groups, including PTO/PTA, League of Women Voters, NAACP,
 Urban League, Equality Ohio, Chambers of Commerce, etc.
 - Find local candidate forums by entering your address at Vote411.org
- Meet and Greets hosted by candidates or supporting organizations

TIP: Bring these helpful **candidate questions** to the events. Take notes on candidate responses, tone, and how they engage or reference other candidates or board members.

STEP 4: Attend school board meetings

Attend board meetings to learn about district priorities and issues, and observe incumbent candidates.

- Find meeting dates and times on your district's website or call the administration office
- Watch live and recorded meetings on your district website, YouTube, or other social media
- Review board meeting documents, including agendas, minutes, proposed policy changes, curriculum updates, and budgets

STEP 5: Assess candidates & create sample ballot

Almost done! Use all of your research to Use all of your research to evaluate and select the best candidates for your district.

- Make a table comparing your priorities with the candidates, and select your final candidates (sample chart)
- Finally, use your final list to create a personalized sample ballot at OhioVoterGuide.org Vote411.org
- Bring your personalized ballot with you to vote!
